

OSHC

Firstly I would like to introduce myself, my name is Peta Watson and I am the new OSHC co-ordinator here at Nilma Primary School. I have been in the Child Care industry for over 15 years with 13 of those running an OSHC service.

I have spent the first weeks of Term meeting the children utilising the OSHC service and getting familiar with how the Service is operating. Xplor is new to me so please be patient as I navigate my way through the system and learn to use it.

I feel the program should be driven by the children's interests and it is obvious that they love to be outside with ball activities and free play. We have enjoyed charades, shooting hoops, games on the playground and of course dodge ball. It is lovely to see the children supporting each other and in particular sharing the ball in both dodgeball and shooting hoops.

Popular inside activities seem to be drawing, puppets, music and construction. I hope to add to the resources over time in order to extend their experiences.

Finally a huge thank you to Saige who has been an amazing support these first weeks as I meet the children, learn a new program and work out how everything operates. Saige has been running a fabulous OSHC program, Nilma Primary School is very lucky to have her. Thank you Saige.

CHANGES TO CHILD CARE SUBSIDY

From **10th July 2023**, most families using early childhood education and care will get more Child Care Subsidy (CCS). Some families previously not eligible for CCS will now get it.

What's changing:

The family income limit to get CCS is increasing to \$530,000.

The maximum amount of CCS is increasing from 85% to 90%.

Families earning \$80,000 or less will get 90% subsidy.

 $Families\ earning\ over\ \$80,\!000\ and\ under\ \$530,\!000\ will\ get\ a\ subsidy\ that\ tapers\ down\ from\ 90\%,\ depending\ on\ their\ income.$

The subsidy will go down 1% for each \$5,000 earned.

Families earning below \$362,408 with more than one child aged 5 or under in care can still get a higher rate for their second and younger children.

ARE YOU ELIGIBLE FOR HELP WITH CHILD CARE FEES?

Families that earn between \$356,756 and \$530,000 may be entitled to CCS from 10th July. Families that haven't claimed CCS, should lodge a claim with Services Australia.

Families can use the CCS Calculator at https://www.startingblocks.gov.au/ to estimate what they might have to pay for early childhood education and care from 10th July.

DO YOU ALREADY GET CHILD CARE SUBSIDY?

Families already getting CCS don't need to do anything to get the new rates. Services Australia will apply the changes for you from 10 July.

All OSHC payments needed to have been finalised by Friday 23rd June 2023
