Building a national picture of child health From May 2024, our school, along with thousands of others across the country, will participate in the Australian Early Development Census (AEDC).

The AEDC is a teacher-completed census (similar to a questionnaire) which provides a comprehensive picture of how children have developed by the time they start their first year of full-time school.

The AEDC is an Australian Government Initiative and is completed nationally every three years.

The data collected through the AEDC is used by schools, communities and governments to better understand children and families' needs, and identify the services, resources and support they need.

All students in Foundation were given a letter and information flier explaining the census.

Attitudes to School Survey The AtoSS is a voluntary annual student survey offered by the Department of Education to assist schools and the department to gain an understanding of students' perceptions and experience of school. We value student voice as a means to improving student engagement, wellbeing and quality instruction and will be asking your child about their thoughts and feelings in relation to their school, their learning, peer relationships, resilience, bullying, health and wellbeing, physical activity, and life in general. This year our school will be conducting the survey in the week beginning Monday 13th May. Information was sent home with all students in Years 4-6.




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time, students

Students especially loved exploring these senses using pieces of popcorn. The students had the opportunity to




look at, smell, feel, touch and even taste the differences between popped and un-popped pieces of popcorn. It was a lot of fun!





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Over the past two weeks, students have been learning about clay.

The two main **characteristics** of clay:

Clay can be moulded and will keep the shape created. When hardened (or kiln-fired), clay is protected from the effects of water.

Challenges when working with clay:

- Modelling with clay can get very messy.
- Without the right tools, the final product of the project can be quite limited.
- It can be tricky to master the techniques of working with clay.
- Working with clay takes time preparation time, the actual making of the product and the final drying or firing.

Tools and equipment used:

- Wooden board Sponges
- Sculpting and carving tools
- Other objects such as sticks, straws, and plastic knives.






MARC LIBRARY NEWS
